# **Litera Speaking Club Framework**

# **Objective:**

- To enhance participants' English speaking skills through interactive discussions about different topics: culture, media, sports, education, environment, etc.
- To broaden participants' vocabulary and fluency in discussing diverse subject matters.
- To broaden participants' cultural knowledge and understanding.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Stable internet access
- Zoom application/Cornell Zoom account
- Discussion prompts chosen by the leader of the speaking club (related to culture, media, sports, education, environment, etc.)
- Optional: presentation slides or multimedia resources featuring information related to the topic of the conversation

**Lesson Plan**: 50-60 minute Zoom session

Welcome and Icebreaker (5-10 minutes):

- Greet participants and briefly review the agenda for the meeting.
- Conduct a short icebreaker activity to warm up the participants and encourage interaction. For example, participants could introduce themselves and share one interesting fact about their life that may or may not be related to the conversation topic of that day

Introduction to the Topic (5-10 minutes):

- Present an overview of the theme for the day
- Share key objectives and expectations for the discussion

Topic Spotlight (10-15 minutes):

- Highlight key aspects, recent developments, and relevant vocabulary related to the topic.
- In this section, you can show short video clips, read through articles/article highlights, or share personal experiences

Group Discussion (30 minutes):

- Provide discussion prompts related to the topic of the day
- Invite participants to share their thoughts, experiences, or opinions on the topic.

- Encourage participants to share their perspectives and talk/respond to each other and not just to you
- If you are comfortable, you can even invite someone to lead the discussion
- Use and encourage the use of new vocabulary and expressions related to the discussed topics
- Provide feedback and language support as needed to help participants improve their fluency and accuracy.

Reflection and Closing (10 minutes):

- Lead a brief reflection session where participants can share their thoughts, insights, and takeaways from the discussion.
- Summarize key points discussed during the meeting.
- If able, provide participants with additional resources that they can study on their own

Note: Adapt the lesson plan duration and activities based on the specific needs and preferences of the club members. Encourage active participation and create a supportive environment where everyone feels comfortable expressing themselves in English.

# **Volunteer Expectations**

As a facilitator of a language conversation hour, there are several expectations and responsibilities to ensure the success of the session and the engagement of participants. Here are some key expectations:

*Main expectation:* Facilitate one 50-60 minute Zoom speaking club session per week <u>Target audience</u>: college-age students and adults in Ukraine

<u>Scheduling:</u> Please provide your availability to the Litera Outreach team for proper scheduling; if you are unable to facilitate a speaking club on one of the days, please let us know in advance so we can cancel or reschedule that meeting. Be available to be contacted via email by the Litera Outreach team.

<u>Privacy:</u> As a general rule and for the benefit of our volunteers, we discourage speaking club volunteers from sharing their personal email, contact number, or social media pages with speaking club participants. #### General expectations:

# Create a Welcoming Environment:

 Foster a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere where participants feel comfortable practicing their language skills and expressing themselves.

# Set Clear Objectives:

 Define clear objectives for each conversation hour, whether it's practicing specific language skills, discussing particular topics, or simply improving fluency and confidence.

# Plan Engaging Activities:

 Prepare 1-2 engaging activities and discussion prompts to stimulate conversation and cater to different learning styles and proficiency levels.

# Encourage Participation:

 Encourage active participation from all participants by asking open-ended questions, prompting discussions, and giving everyone an opportunity to speak.

# Provide Language Support:

 Offer language support and guidance to participants as needed, including clarification of vocabulary, grammar, and pronunciation.

# Manage Time Effectively:

 Manage the time of the conversation hour effectively to ensure that you are within a timeframe of approximately one hour

## Facilitate Group Dynamics:

 Foster positive group dynamics by facilitating interactions, mediating conflicts, and ensuring that everyone has a chance to contribute to the conversation.

#### Offer Constructive Feedback:

 Provide constructive feedback to participants on their language skills, communication style, and areas for improvement, while also offering praise and encouragement for their efforts.

### Cultural Sensitivity:

 Be culturally sensitive and respectful of participants' backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences, and encourage cross-cultural exchange and understanding.

#### Promote Learning Resources:

 Recommend learning resources, such as books, online courses, or language apps, to help participants continue their language learning outside of the conversation hour.

# Adaptability:

 Be flexible and adaptable to the needs and preferences of participants, adjusting activities and topics based on their interests and feedback.

# Lead by Example:

 Demonstrate enthusiasm, patience, and a positive attitude toward language learning, serving as a role model for participants.

#### Seek Feedback:

• Solicit feedback from participants to assess the effectiveness of the conversation hour, gather suggestions for improvement, and ensure that their needs are being met.

# Open-Mindedness:

### Punctuality:

- Provide the Litera team with your availability for the speaking clubs
- Arrive on time for club meetings and activities.
- Notify the Litera Outreach team in advance if unable to attend a meeting so that the meeting can be canceled or rescheduled

#### Confidentiality:

Respect the privacy and confidentiality of club members.

 Refrain from sharing personal information or sensitive topics discussed within the club outside of meetings.

#### Constructive Feedback:

- Provide feedback in a constructive and supportive manner.
- Offer praise for contributions and efforts made by fellow club members.
- Offer suggestions for improvement in a respectful and considerate way.

## Safety and Well-being:

- Create a safe and welcoming environment where members feel comfortable expressing themselves.
- Report any concerns or incidents of harassment or misconduct to club officers.

#### Adherence to Club Policies:

 Follow the club's guidelines, policies, and procedures as established by club officers, Campus Groups, and Cornell University

- Take responsibility for one's own actions and behavior within the club.
- Contribute positively to the overall success and well-being of the club.

# **Practical Language Practice**
